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The Vinschgau valley in winter

The Vinschgau valley offers a wide range of activities for winter sports enthusiasts. At the Two Country Ski Area, skiers can glide across the border in five ski areas using just one ski pass.

The fun parks, toboggan runs and cross-country ski tracks (at low and high altitudes) are both challenging and fun. Ski tourists can ascend to sunny heights where they are rewarded by a fantastic mountain panorama. Snowshoeing is great for exploring secluded winter trails.

Nordic ski sports centres can be found in Schlinging/Slingia with its cross-country ski tracks and in the Martell valley for biathlon. The Reschensee and Haidersee lakes are popular with ice skaters, ice boat racers and snowkickers from across Europe.



Glurns Medieval jewel

Its 900 inhabitants make Glurns/Glorenza the smallest town in South Tyrol, and one of the smallest in the world. First mentioned in 1304, Glurns has retained its medieval flair to this day. In addition to its medieval town centre, this little jewel also boasts the only remaining enclosed fort in the Alpine region, complete with fully intact curtain walls and three picturesque gate towers.
